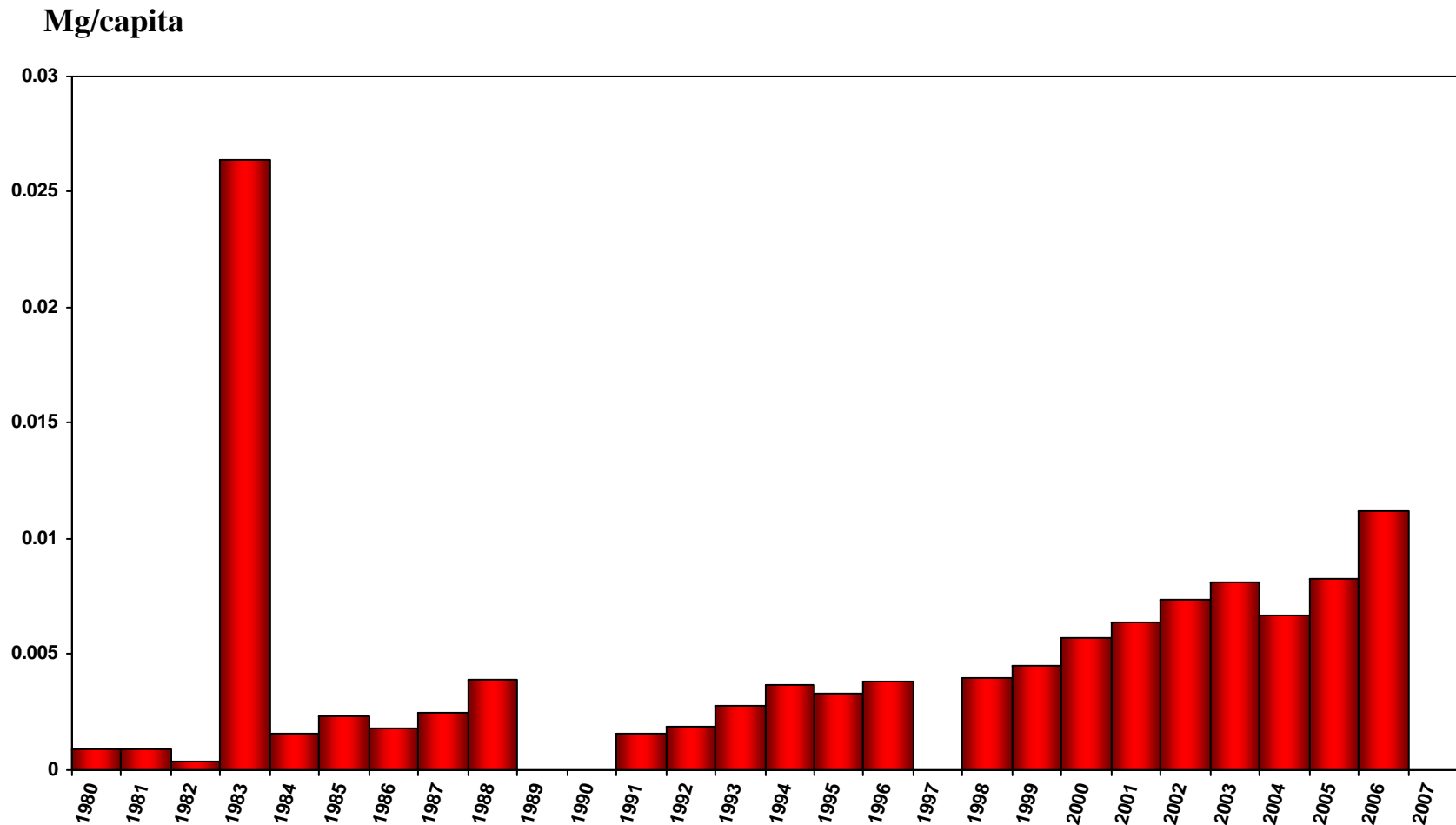
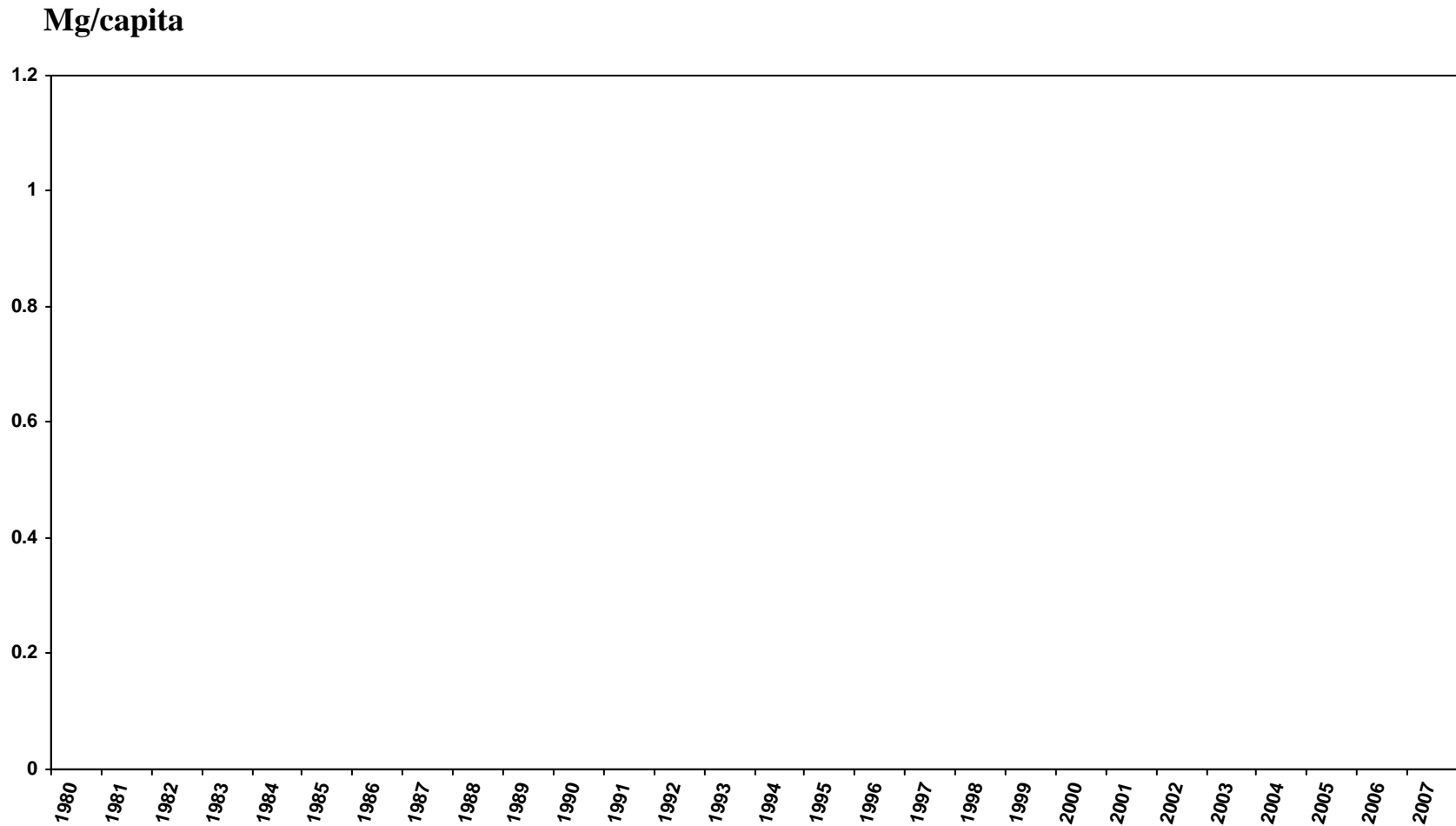


Mg/capita Consumption of Fentanyl, Costa Rica, 1980-2007



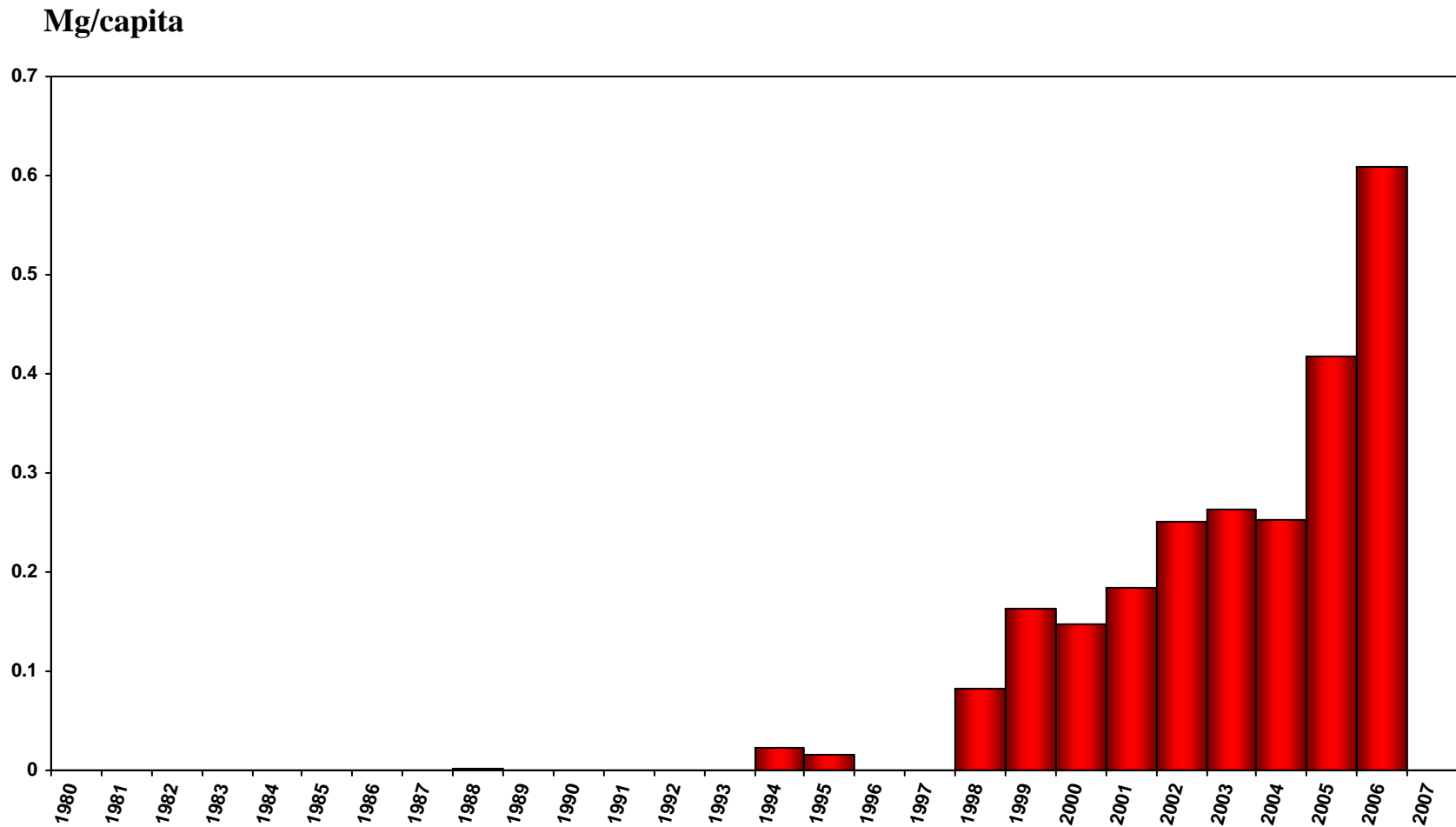

Mg/capita Consumption of Hydromorphone, Costa Rica, 1980-2007



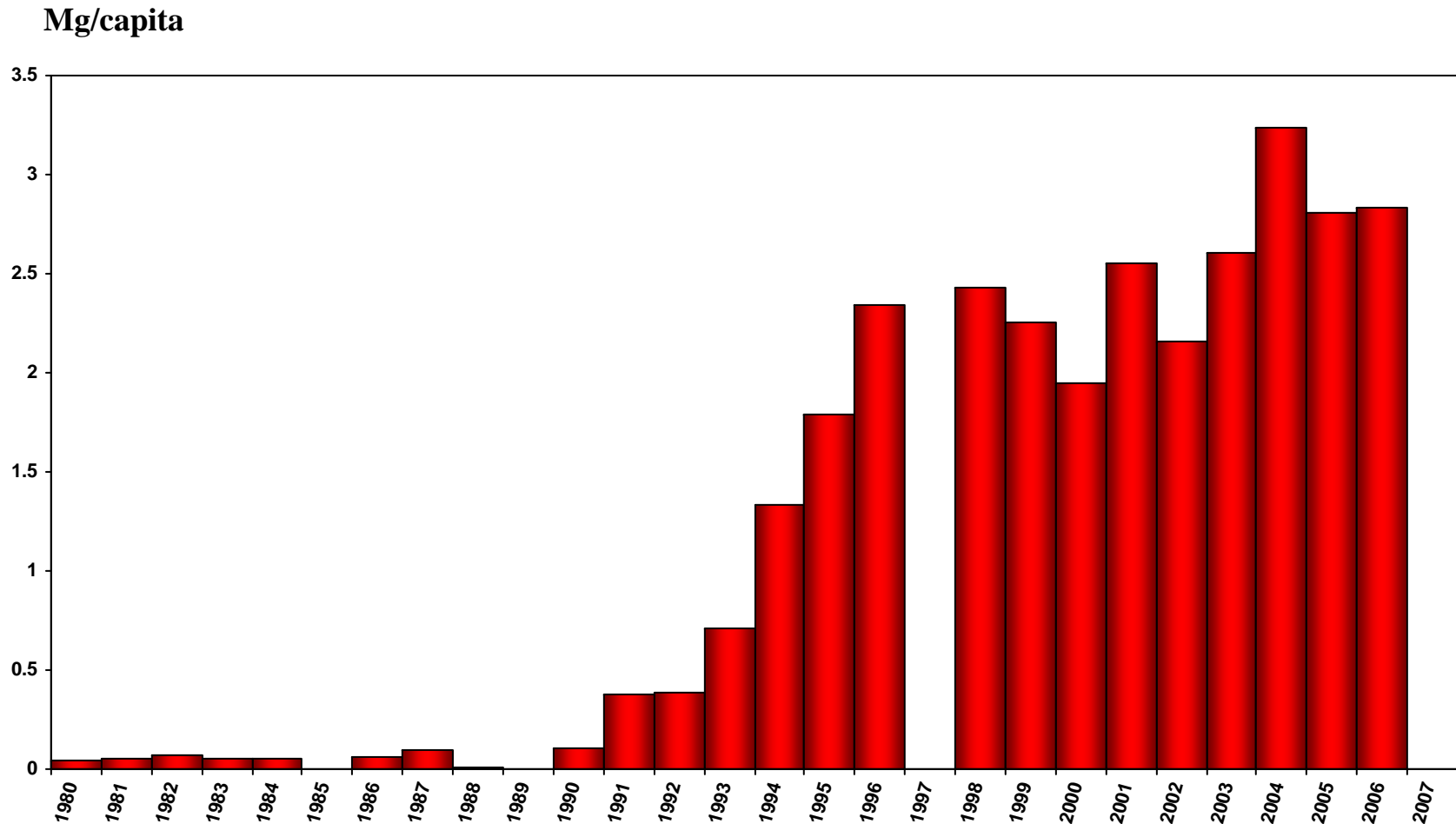

Mg/capita Consumption of Methadone, Costa Rica, 1980-2007



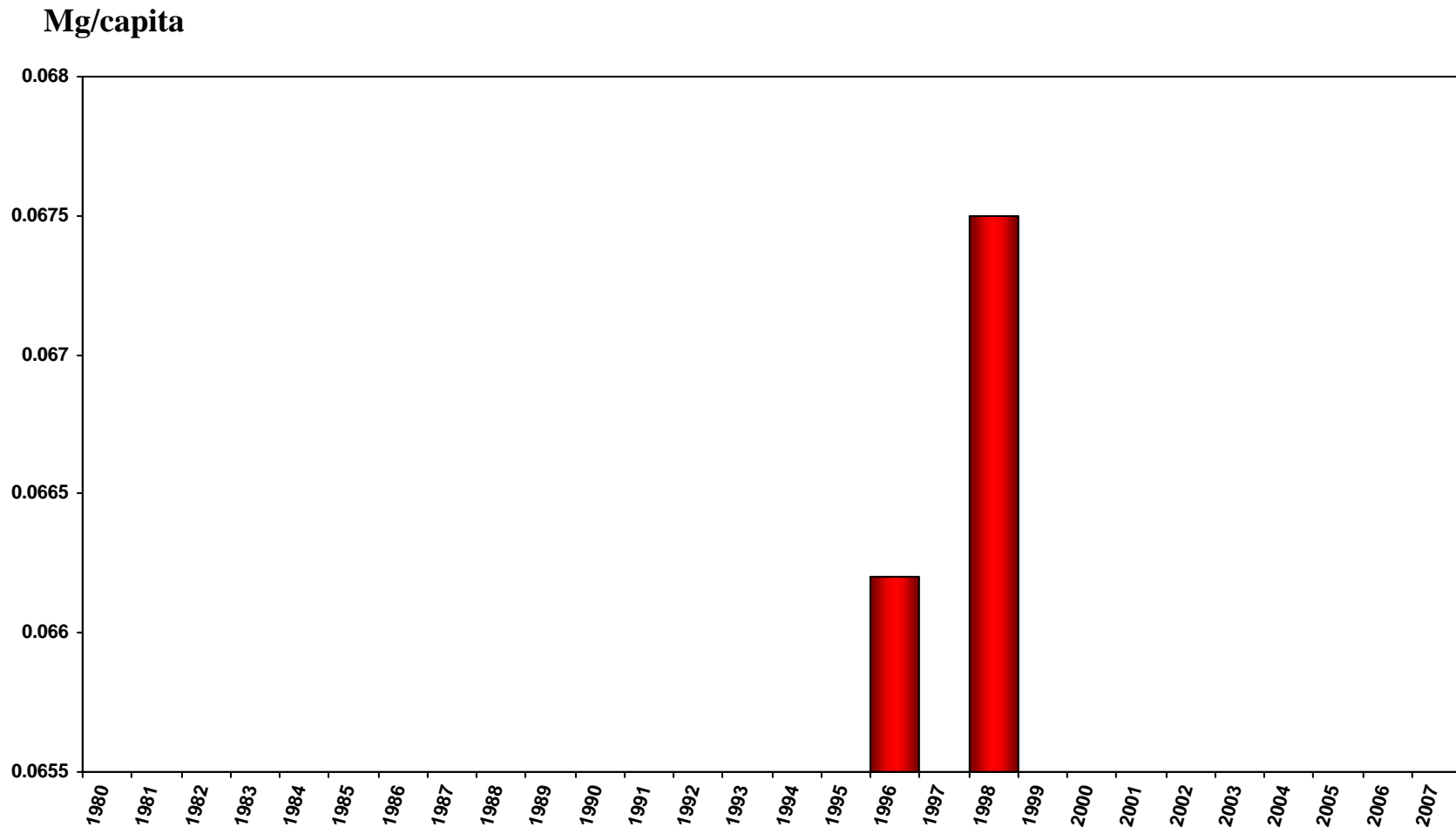

Mg/capita Consumption of Morphine, Costa Rica, 1980-2007



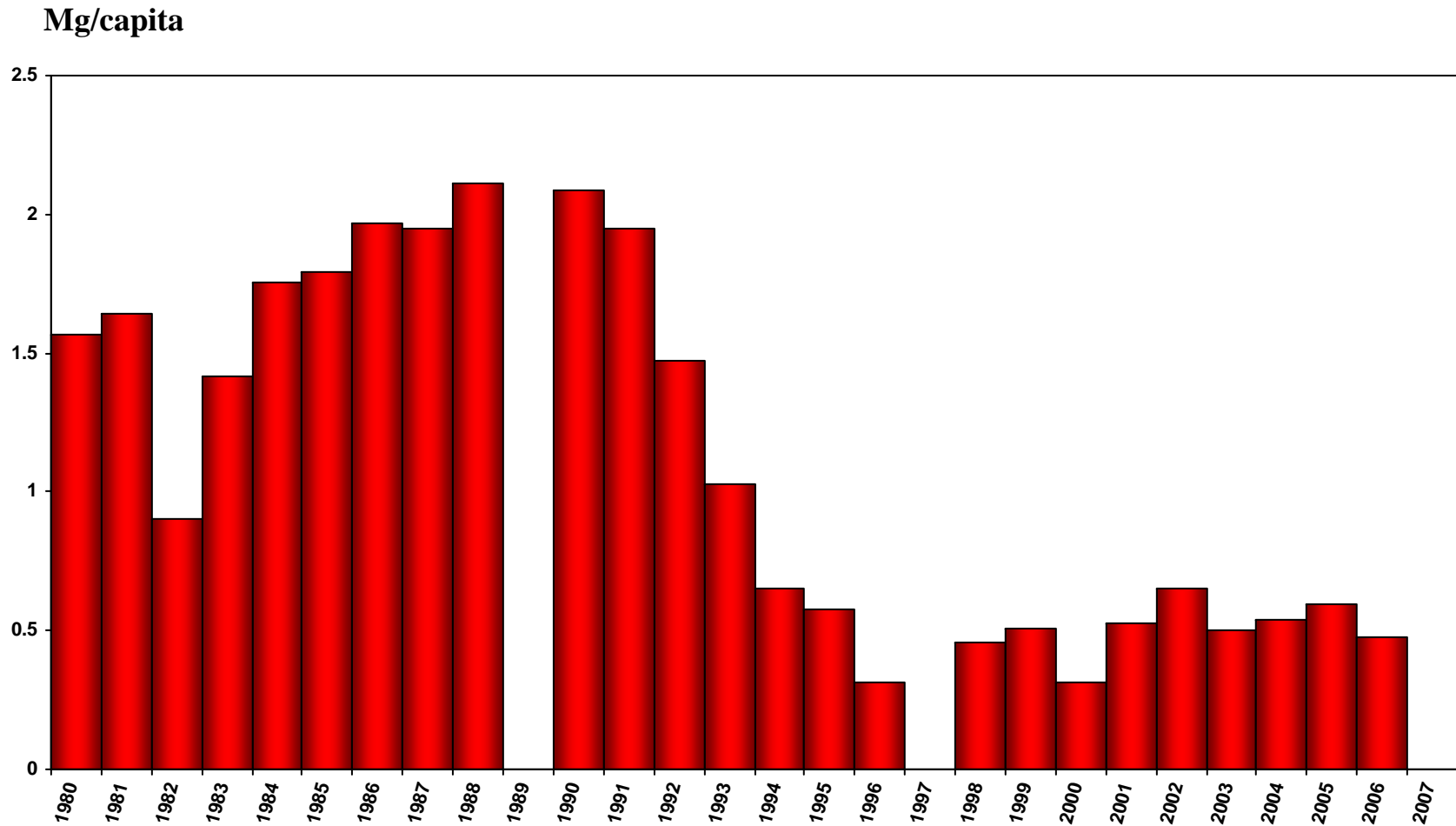
