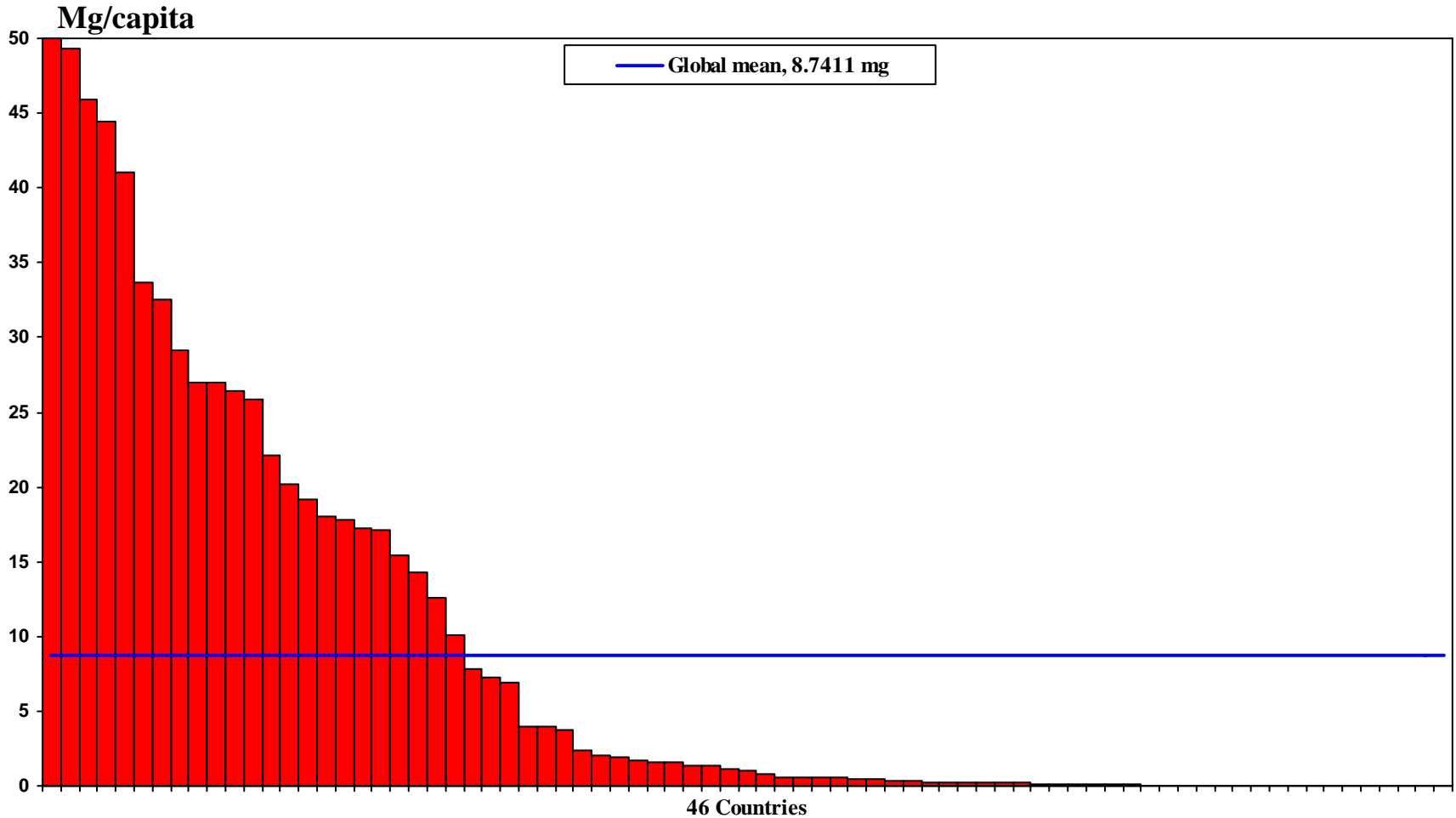


# 2006 Global Consumption of Methadone
